Talks

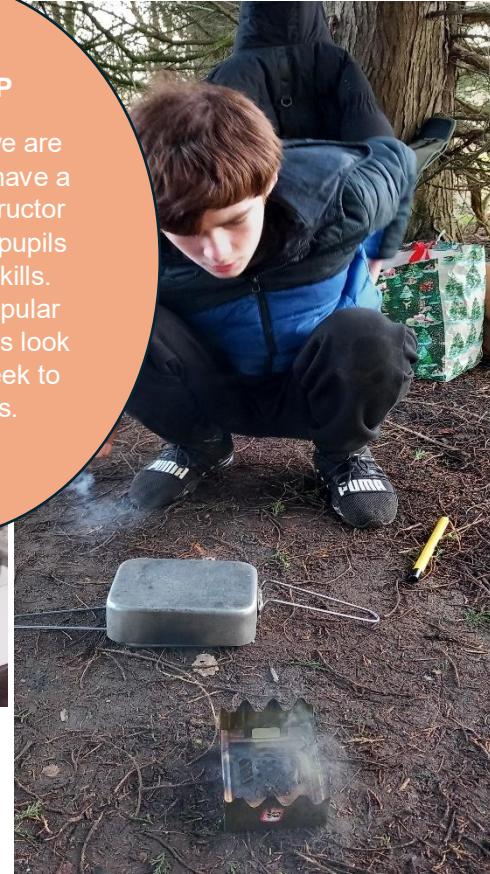


We were lucky enough to have a talk given to pupils about knife crime and the Joe Dix foundation came to site to deliver this.
